# Minutes of the Meeting of the Board of Directors Clayton Water District held on March 6, 2019

### 1. Call to Order:

The board meeting for Clayton Water District was called to order at 11:12 a.m. at the office of Baker Manock and Jensen by President Larkin Harman. Board members present were Larkin Harman, Connley Clayton and Robin Clayton. Members of the public included: Lauren Layne of Baker Manock and Jensen, Julia Berry, Sarah Woolf, Lisa Baker, and George Park.

### 2. Public Comment:

George Park commented that Lone tree Mutual Water Company is interested to find ways to recharge in partnership with CLWD, and would like to investigate sharing costs. He is interested in injection wells and advocates for looking at the shallow and deep acquifer separately.

### 3. Minutes:

Connley Clayton made a motion to approve the minutes from the February 6, 2019 board meeting. The motion was seconded by Robin Clayton and it passed unanimously.

# 4. Treasurer's Report:

Connley Clayton reported that the beginning balance on February 1, 2019 was \$8,500.06, and on February 28, 2019 was \$8,138.98. Two expenses were paid February in the amounts of \$861.02 and \$361.08.

Director Harman made a motion to accept the report, seconded by Director R. Clayton, and the motion passed unanimously.

Director R. Clayton made a motion to adopt the proposed budget for FY 2019-2020, seconded by Director Connley Clayton, and the motion passed unanimously.

#### 5. Committee Reports:

The committee gave a recommendation to the Board not to pay additional costs associated with the Municipal Services Review (MSR). And recommended that the projects discussed at the January Public Workshop be qualified and selected as appropriate for the Chowchilla Subbasin Groundwater Sustainability Plan projects list.

### 6. Staff Report:

- (a) Update on Annexation
  - i. MSR Review Status

The Board discussed the proposal from Precision Engineering for additional payment due to additional time spent on the Municipal Services Review (MSR). The Board gave

direction to staff to ask Precision to present the costs associated with (1) writing legal descriptions; (2) surveying (if applicable).

Secondly, the Board directed staff to look into the Triangle T Sphere of influence as it may overlap to landowners annexing into the CLWD.

# (b) Water Supply Projects/Opportunities

i. 2019 Water Supply

Water is running in the Fresno River and some landowners are diverting water from the Eastside Bypass. We are in uncontrolled season currently. Case Vlot, Scott Menefee and Larkin Harman are doing rotational pumping.

ii. Merced Regional Advisory Committee (RAC) Meeting February 26, 2019- Grant Funding Round 1 & 2, Merced Integrated Regional Water Management Plan

Staff reported that a meeting occurred on February 26, 2019 where a project was presented on behalf of CLWD for a feasibility study and construction of Conveyance facilities to connect CLWD to Westside and Merced Irrigation District water supplies, to be funded by the Merced Integrated Regional Water Management Plan Proposition 1 grant funding. Funds will require a match from the District, potentially at a 50% level match.

# (c) Eastside Bypass Water Rights Application:

Chris White organized a meeting with USBR. Fish screens will be required of every diverter. There may be an opportunity to negotiate the phasing of fish screens, based on flow. USBR has offered to help look for federal grant money to help with the cost and will try to manipulate flow rate requirements with fish screens, i.e. higher flow rates may not require screens. Lower flow rates could be required to have screens first, higher flow rates later, potentially. Sarah Woolf indicated that another meeting will occur in March.

(d) Staff reported that the Madera County Flood Management Agency is planning a Proposition 218 election to fund flood management projects and activities.

### 7. Legal Counsel Report:

Counselor Layne reported that the fertilizer tax (mill tax) from the 2018 legislative session is back again in 2019. ACWA has introduced the concept of a trust fund for funding this from the General Fund. Senator Manning has introduced similar language through SB 200. Mathis has a spot bill on SGMA with no language: AB 336 is a placeholder at this time. AB 441 (Eggman) declares underground storage as a reasonable and beneficial use of water.

Laurel Firestone has been appointed to the State Water Resources Control Board, taking Felicia Marcus's position.
