The Board of Supervisors (acting as the Board of Directors for the County GSA) is exploring ways to your groundwater rates in the County GSA, Madera Subbasin, including pursuing grants, looking for measures, and evaluating partnerships. If a temporary injunction on groundwater rates is lifted, the assess a lower alternative rate for projects in addition to the GSA Admin Fee. Along with a potential rates comes a smaller scale of projects and a corresponding reduction in expected 2040 allocation table of potential rates. All alternatives are subject to additional review. Harvest Season Increases Equipment and Vehicles on Rural Roads

Throughout the Central Valley, farms are humming with activity as many of our 350+ crops are harvested this time of year. August and September are typically considered peak season, though there's always something in season locally.

Harvest brings along with it increased traffic to rural roads during all hours of the day and night, including harvesters, tractors, trucks and vehicles. Many times, these pieces of equipment are moving much slower than the posted maximum speed, thus caution and patience needs to be exercised by fellow drivers. The public is urged to slow down, pass only when lawful and safe, and recognize visibility can be difficult during certain periods of the day and night.
