CONFLICT OF INTEREST CODE FOR THE GRAVELLY FORD WATER DISTRICT

The Political Reform Act, Government Code Sections 81000, et seq., requires state and local government agencies to adopt and promulgate Conflict of Interest Codes. The Fair Political Practices Commission has adopted Regulatory Regulation, 2 Cal. Code of Regs. Section 18730, which contains the terms of a standard Conflict of Interest Code, which can be incorporated by reference, and which may be amended by the Fair Political Practices Commission to conform to amendments in the Political Reform Act after public notice and hearing. Therefore, the terms of 2 Cal. Code of Regs. Section 18730 and any amendments to it duly adopted by the Fair Political Practices Commission, along with the attached Appendix A in which officials and employees are designated and disclosure categories are set forth, are hereby incorporated by reference and constitute the Conflict of Interest Code of the Gravelly Ford Water District.

The Board of Directors shall file their Conflict of Interest statements with the Clerk of the Madera County Board of Supervisors who is designated as the filing officer for the District Directors by the Cal. Code of Regs. as amended.

The General Manager/Manager and Controller (if any) and the District Engineer (PE & PLS) and certain other consultants (if any) shall file their Conflict of Interest statements with the District.

Statements on file with the District will be available for public inspection and reproduction. (Gov. Code Sections 81008). Required statements for employees will be retained by the District.

CONFLICT OF INTEREST CODE FOR THE GRAVELLY FORD WATER DISTRICT APPENDIX A

General Provisions

- Investments and business positions in any business entity or sources of income listed under "Reportable Items" of this Appendix A are disclosable if:
 - a. The business entity in which the investment or business position is held is of the type which has contracted with Gravelly Ford Water District within the previous two years; or
 - b. The business entity in which the investment or business position is held is
 of the type which has contracted within the previous two years to furnish
 supplies or services as subcontractors in any contract with Gravelly Ford
 Water District; or
 - c. The sources of income are of the type which have contracted with the District within the previous calendar year; or
 - d. The sources of income are of the type which have contracted within the previous calendar year to furnish supplies or services as subcontractors in any contract with Gravelly Ford Water District.
- Investments and business positions in any business entity or sources of income
 which are (1) private water companies, or (2) entities or persons engaged in
 farming, real estate development, or owners of real estate; and interests in real
 property are disclosable if held, regardless of any contractual relationship with
 Gravelly Ford Water District at any time.

Nothing herein excuses any such consultant from any other provision of this Conflict of Interest Code.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT Gravelly Ford's current designated positions requiring the filing of Form 700 in that form's categories A, B, C, D, and E are the directors, general manager, district engineer (PE & PLS), controller/auditor (if any), and periodic consultants, if any (if they make or participate in making decisions which may foreseeably have a material effect on economic interests) in accordance with the Conflict of Interest Code for Gravelly Ford Water District attached Resolution and;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT the Designated employees shall file their Form 700 statements of economic interests with the code reviewing body, that is, with the Madera County Clerk of the Board of Supervisors who is designated as the filing officer for the District Directors by the Cal. Code of Regs., as amended. However, the general manager/manager and controller (if any) and the District Engineer (PE & PLS) and certain other consultants (if any) shall file their Conflict of Interest statements with this District.

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2024 Conflict of Interest Code Biennial Notice Instructions for Local Agencies

The Political Reform Act requires every local government agency to review its conflict of interest code biennially. A conflict of interest code tells public officials, governmental employees, and consultants what financial interests they must disclose on their Statement of Economic Interests (Form 700).

By **July 1**, **2024:** The code reviewing body must notify agencies and special districts within its jurisdiction to review their conflict of interest codes.

By October 1, 2024: The biennial notice must be filed with the agency's code reviewing body.

The FPPC has prepared a 2024 Local Agency Biennial Notice form for local agencies to complete or send to agencies within its jurisdiction to complete before submitting to the code reviewing body. The City Council is the code reviewing body for city agencies. The County Board of Supervisors is the code reviewing body for county agencies and any other local government agency whose jurisdiction is determined to be solely within the county (e.g., school districts, including certain charter schools). The FPPC is the code reviewing body for any agency with jurisdiction in *more than one county* and will contact them.

The Local Agency Biennial Notice is not forwarded to the FPPC.

If amendments to an agency's conflict of interest code are necessary, the amended code must be forwarded to the code reviewing body for approval within 90 days. An agency's amended code is not effective until it has been approved by the code reviewing body.

If you answer yes, to any of the questions below, your agency's code probably needs to be amended.

- Is the current code more than five years old?
- Have there been any substantial changes to the agency's organizational structure since the last code was approved?
- Have any positions been eliminated or re-named since the last code was approved?
- Have any new positions been added since the last code was approved?
- Have there been any substantial changes in duties or responsibilities for any positions since the last code was approved?
