## The Pre-Application is Now Available!

All parties who are interested in participating in the MLRP Madera program and funding opportunity must first submit a <u>Pre-Application</u> prior to **November 22**, **2024**. This is the deadline for the pre-application and eligibility screening process. Applicants who pass the eligibility screening will be invited to develop full project proposals, which will not be due until February 2025. All GSAs in Madera County are eligible for this program.

#### How to Apply

There are three options for applicants to fill-out and submit the Pre-Application Form.



#### Chowchilla Subbasin GSP

As required by SGMA, the four GSAs submitted Chowchilla Subbasin's Groundwater Sustainability Plan (GSP) in January 2020. The purpose of this GSP is to characterize groundwater conditions in the Subbasin, to evaluate and report on conditions of overdraft, to establish sustainability goals, and to describe projects and management actions the GSAs will implement to achieve sustainable groundwater management by 2040.

The GSAs have submitted three revised GSPs – July 2022, May 2023 and August 2024 – following feedback and collaboration from the Department of Water Resources and State Water Resources Control Board.



Learn more about the Chowchilla Subbasin GSP In September 2014, the California legislature passed the Sustainable Groundwater Management Act (SGMA), establishing new measures for groundwater management and regulation statewide. SGMA provides for local control of groundwater resources while requiring sustainable management of the state's groundwater basins. Under the provisions of SGMA, local agencies must establish governance of their subbasins by forming Groundwater Sustainability Agencies (GSAs) with the authority to develop, adopt, and Implement a Groundwater Sustainability Plan (GSP) for the subbasin.

The Chowchilla Subbasin covers approximately 146,000 acres in Merced and Madera Counties. There are four GSAs that represent the subbasin -Chowchilla Water District GSA, Madera County GSA, Merced County GSA, and Triangle T Water District GSA.

#### DWR's Fall 2024 Semi-Annual Groundwater Conditions Update

The DWR has released the Fall 2024 Semi-Annual Groundwater Conditions
Update.

This report looks at groundwater conditions after California's record-setting 2023 Water Year and during the average 2024 Water Year. It also highlights groundwater conditions from the initial decade of SGMA implementation (2014– 2024). The update includes data from local Groundwater Sustainability Agencies (GSAs) across 99 basins, which represent over 90% of the state's groundwater use.
