Step 4	If you have hot water heat, open the drain faucet on the boiler and let the water flow into the floor drain. Next, remove an air vert from a radiator on the top floor so that air will replace the water as it drains into the boiler.	supply, save a few gallons of water for drinking or cooking and draw enough extra water to prepare an antifreeze mix that you will need to protect the traps.
Step 5	Working floor by floor, starting at the top, open all hot and cold water faucets – including all tubs, showers and outdoor faucets – and flush all toilets.
