JANUARY 21, 2025 RESOLUTION NO. 2025-GSA01

RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS, MADERA IRRIGATION DISTRICT GROUNDWATER SUSTAINABILITY AGENCY ADOPTION OF JOINT GROUNDWATER SUSTAINABILITY PLAN 2025 PLAN AMENDMENT

RESOLVED by the Board of Directors of the Madera Irrigation District Groundwater Sustainability Agency ("MID GSA"), at a regular meeting duly called and held on January 21, 2025 at the business office of the MID GSA, 12152 Road 28 1/4, Madera, California 93637 as follows:

WHEREAS, the California Legislature passed a statewide framework for sustainable groundwater management, known as the Sustainable Groundwater Management Act ("SGMA"), in California Water Code §10720 *et seq.*, pursuant to Senate Bill 1168, Senate Bill 1319, and Assembly Bill 1739, which was approved by the Governor and Chaptered by the Secretary of State on September 16, 2014; and

WHEREAS, SGMA requires that each groundwater basin be managed by a Groundwater Sustainability Agency ("GSA"), or multiple GSAs, and that such management be pursuant to an approved Groundwater Sustainability Plan ("GSP"), or multiple GSPs; and

WHEREAS, the Madera Groundwater Subbasin ("Madera Subbasin") has been designated by the Department of Water Resources ("DWR") as a high-priority basin and in critical groundwater overdraft (DWR Bulletin 118 Groundwater Basin No. 5-022.06); and

WHEREAS, the Madera Irrigation District GSA is the exclusive GSA under SGMA for certain portions of the Madera Subbasin; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Water Code section 10727, SGMA requires that a GSP, or multiple GSPs, be developed and implemented by January 31, 2020 for each high-priority basin in critical groundwater overdraft: and

WHEREAS, Madera Water District GSA, the County of Madera GSA – Madera Subbasin, Madera Irrigation District GSA, and City of Madera GSA have collaboratively developed and adopted one joint GSP ("Madera Subbasin Joint GSP"); Root Creek Water District GSA has developed and adopted one GSP; Gravelly Ford Water District GSA has developed and adopted one GSP; and New Stone Water District GSA has developed and adopted one GSP, such that the Madera Subbasin is governed by four separate GSPs unified through the Madera Subbasin Coordination Agreement; and

WHEREAS, the Madera Subbasin has no adjudicated areas or areas covered by an Alternative to a GSP as described in Water Code Section 10733.6; and

WHEREAS, on or about January 31, 2020, the Madera Subbasin Joint GSP was submitted to DWR for review, public comment, and approval; and

WHEREAS, DWR did not initiate review of the four GSPs until October 9, 2020; and

WHEREAS, on September 22, 2022, DWR completed a review of the four GSPs and Madera Subbasin Coordination Agreement submitted January 31, 2020 and sent a letter to the Madera Subbasin Point of Contact (John Davids of Davids Engineering, Inc.) stating that the four GSPs and Madera Subbasin Coordination Agreement were determined to be incomplete; and

WHEREAS, the Subbasin GSAs acted quickly to develop and submit four Revised GSPs and the Amended Madera Subbasin Coordination Agreement to DWR on or about March 21, 2023; and

WHEREAS, on December 21, 2023, DWR completed a review of the four Revised GSPs and the Amended Madera Subbasin Coordination Agreement submitted on or about March 21, 2023 and sent a letter to the Madera Subbasin Point of Contact stating that the four Revised GSPs and the Amended Madera Subbasin Coordination Agreement were approved, with certain recommended corrective actions; and

WHEREAS, Madera Water District GSA, County of Madera GSA – Madera Subbasin, Madera Irrigation District GSA, and City of Madera GSA have completed additional amendments to the Madera Subbasin Joint GSP consistent with the recommended corrective actions provided by DWR in their December 21, 2023 letter; and

WHEREAS, the Madera Subbasin Joint GSP amendments completed in January 2025 are commonly referred to as the Joint GSP 2025 Plan Amendment; and

WHEREAS, Madera County and the City of Madera provided the Subbasin GSAs a notice waiving the 90-day notice requirements pursuant to Water Code section 10728.4; and

WHEREAS, a public workshop webinar was held on December 5, 2024 to describe and solicit public input on the Joint GSP 2025 Plan Amendment; and

WHEREAS, upon adoption of a GSP, Water Code section 10733.4 requires that the GSP be submitted to DWR for review.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Directors of the MID GSA, as follows:

- 1. The above Recitals are hereby incorporated into by reference and are made a substantive part of this resolution.
- 2. The Joint GSP 2025 Plan Amendment in the form presented at the Public Hearing is hereby approved and adopted.
- 3. The General Manager of the MID GSA is hereby authorized and directed to timely provide notification of this approval and adoption to DWR, including a copy of this Resolution and any additional information required by law.

RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS, MADERA IRRIGATION DISTRICT GROUNDWATER SUSTAINABILITY AGENCY APPROVING THE MADERA SUBBASIN SECOND AMENDMENT TO THE COORDINATION AGREEMENT

RESOLVED by the Board of Directors of the Madera Irrigation District Groundwater Sustainability Agency ("MID GSA"), at a regular meeting duly called and held on January 21, 2025 at the business office of the MID GSA, 12152 Road 28 1/4, Madera, California 93637 as follows:

WHEREAS, on September 16, 2014, the Governor of the State of California signed the Sustainable Groundwater Management Act ("SGMA") into law, consisting of Senate Bills 1168 and 1319, and Assembly Bill 1739 collectively, codified at Water Code Sections 10720 *et seq.*; and

WHEREAS, the Groundwater Sustainability Agencies for the County of Madera ("County"), City of Madera ("City"), Madera Irrigation District ("MID"), Madera Water District ("MWD"), Root Creek Water District ("RCWD"), Gravelly Ford Water District ("GFWD"), and New Stone Water District ("NSWD"), (collectively the "Parties) overlie the Madera Groundwater Subbasin ("Madera Subbasin"), which is defined by the California Department of Water Resources ("DWR") in Bulletin 118 as Basin Number 5-22.06, and may be modified from time to time in accordance with Water Code section 10722.2; and

WHEREAS, the Madera Subbasin has been designated by DWR as a high-priority basin in a state of "critical overdraft"; and

WHEREAS, SGMA requires that California groundwater basins and subbasins be managed by a Groundwater Sustainability Agency ("GSA") or multiple GSAs, and that such management be implemented pursuant to an approved Groundwater Sustainability Plan ("GSP") or multiple coordinated GSPs; and

WHEREAS, the County, City, MID, and MWD have developed one GSP; RCWD has developed one GSP; GFWD has developed one GSP; and NSWD has developed one GSP, such that the Madera Subbasin is governed by four separate GSPs; and

WHEREAS, SGMA requires GSAs in all subbasins that are managed by more than one GSP to enter into a coordination agreement to coordinate the multiple GSPs to sustainably manage the subbasin; and

WHEREAS, in January 2020, the Parties entered into a Coordination Agreement ("Agreement"); and

WHEREAS, in March 2023, the Parties executed the first amendment to the Agreement; and

WHEREAS, the Agreement terminated on December 31, 2024; and

WHEREAS, the Parties desire to enter into a Second Amendment to the Coordination Agreement, attached hereto as Exhibit "A" to extend the effective date until December 31, 2040, as required by SGMA; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of Directors of the Madera Irrigation District Groundwater Sustainability Agency, that the facts contained in the recitals above are true and correct, and that the Board hereby approves the Second Amendment to the Coordination Agreement with the Parties, a copy of which is attached hereto as Exhibit "A" and authorizes the Board President to execute the Coordination Agreement in the substantial form presented and all associated and necessary documentation, subject to such reasonable modifications, revisions, additions and deletions as he may approve prior to execution, said execution to provide conclusive evidence of such approval.

SECOND AMENDMENT TO THE MADERA SUBBASIN COORDINATION AGREEMENT

This SECOND AMENDMENT (AMENDMENT) to the MADERA SUBBASIN COORDINATION AGREEMENT ("Agreement") is entered into the _____day of January 2025 (the "Effective Date"), by and between the Groundwater Sustainability Agencies of the COUNTY OF MADERA ("County"), the CITY OF MADERA ("City"), the MADERA IRRIGATION DISTRICT ("MID"), the ROOT CREEK WATER DISTRICT ("RCWD"), the MADERA WATER DISTRICT ("MWD"), the GRAVELLY FORD WATER DISTRICT ("GFWD"), and the NEW STONE WATER DISTRICT ("NSWD"), collectively hereinafter referred to as the "Parties," or individually as the "Party."

RECITALS

- A. WHEREAS, groundwater and surface water resources within the Madera Subbasin of the San Joaquin Valley Groundwater Basin (DWR Bulletin 118 No. 5-22.06) (Subbasin) are vitally important resources, in that they provide the foundation to maintain and fulfill current and future environmental, agricultural, domestic, municipal, and industrial needs, and to maintain the economic viability, prosperity, and sustainable management of the Subbasin; and
- B. WHEREAS, agriculture has been prominent in making Madera County one of the world's foremost agricultural areas and plays a major role in the economy of Madera County; and
- C. WHEREAS, in 2014 the California Legislature passed a statewide framework for sustainable groundwater management, known as the Sustainable Groundwater Management Act, California Water Code § 10720-10737.8 (SGMA), pursuant to Senate Bill 1168, Senate Bill 1319, and Assembly Bill 1739, which was approved by the Governor on September 16, 2014. and went into effect on January 1, 2015; and
- D. **WHEREAS**, the Subbasin has been designated by the California Department of Water Resources (DWR) as a high-priority subbasin in a condition of critical groundwater overdraft and is subject to the requirements of SGMA; and
- E. WHEREAS, SGMA requires that all medium and high priority groundwater basins in California be managed by a Groundwater Sustainability Agency (GSA), or multiple GSAs, and that such management be implemented pursuant to an approved Groundwater Sustainability Plan (GSP), or multiple GSPs; and
- F. WHEREAS, County, City, MID, and MWD have developed one GSP; RCWD has developed one GSP; GFWD has developed one GSP; and NSWD has developed one GSP, such that the Subbasin is governed by four separate GSPs unified through the Agreement; and
- G. WHEREAS, in January 2020, the Parties submitted four GSPs to DWR; and
- H. WHEREAS, in January 2020, the Parties entered into the Agreement; and

- I. WHEREAS, in March 2023, the Parties executed the first amendment to the Agreement; and
- J. **WHEREAS**, the Agreement was defined as remaining in effect until December 31, 2024 unless terminated earlier by the Parties.
- K. **NOW, THEREFORE**, in consideration of the mutual promises, covenants and conditions contained herein and these Recitals, which are hereby incorporated herein by this reference, the Parties agree to amend the Agreement as follows:

AGREEMENT

- 1. **TERMINATION DATE.** The Parties agree that the Agreement shall remain in effect until December 31, 2040 unless terminated earlier by the Parties as provided in the Agreement.
- 2. NOTICES. All notices required or permitted by the AMENDMENT shall be made in writing and may be delivered in person (by hand or by courier) or may be sent regular, certified, or registered mail or U.S. Postal Service Express Mail, with postage prepaid, or by facsimile transmission, or by electronic transmission (email) and shall be deemed sufficiently given if served in a manner specified in this section. If notice is received after 4:00 p.m. or on a Saturday, Sunday or legal holiday, it shall be deemed received on the next business day.

WHEREAS, groundwater and surface water resources within the Madera and Kings Subbasins of the San Joaquin Valley Groundwater Basin (DWR Bulletin 118 No. 5-22.06 and 5-22.08 respectively) ("Subbasins") are vitally important resources, in that they provide the foundation to maintain and fulfill current and future environmental, agricultural, domestic, municipal, and industrial needs, and to maintain the economic viability, prosperity, and sustainable management of the Subbasins; and

WHEREAS, on September 16, 2014, the Governor of the State of California signed the Sustainable Groundwater Management Act ("SGMA") into law, consisting of Senate Bills 1168 and 1319, and Assembly Bill 1739 collectively, codified at Water Code Sections 10720 *et seq.*; and

WHEREAS, the Kings and Madera Subbasins have been designated by the California Department of Water Resources ("DWR") as high-priority subbasins in a condition of critical groundwater overdraft and subject to the requirements of SGMA; and

WHEREAS, SGMA requires that California groundwater basins and subbasins be managed by a Groundwater Sustainability Agency ("GSA") or multiple GSAs, and that such management be implemented pursuant to an approved Groundwater Sustainability Plan ("GSP") or multiple coordinated GSPs; and

WHEREAS, the signatories to the Memorandum of Understanding Establishing an Interconnected Surface Water Working Group include the Madera Subbasin GSAs of Madera County GSA, City of Madera GSA, Madera Irrigation District GSA, Gravelly Ford Water District GSA, Madera Water District GSA, Root Creek Water District GSA, and New Stone Water District GSA, the United States Bureau of Reclamation, Friant Water Authority, North Kings GSA, and McMullin GSA, collectively referred to as "Parties" and

WHEREAS, the Parties have been meeting in good faith to discuss interconnected surface water-groundwater since late 2023; and

WHEREAS, the Parties desire to enter into the Memorandum of Understanding Establishing an Interconnected Surface Water Working Group, attached hereto as Exhibit "A"; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of Directors of the Madera Irrigation District Groundwater Sustainability Agency, that the facts contained in the recitals above are true and correct, and that the Board hereby approves the Memorandum of Understanding Establishing an Interconnected Surface Water Working Group with the Parties, a copy of which is attached hereto as Exhibit "A" and authorizes the Board President to execute the Memorandum of Understanding in the substantial

form presented and all associated and necessary documentation, subject to such reasonable modifications, revisions, additions and deletions as he may approve prior to execution, said execution to provide conclusive evidence of such approval.

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING ESTABLISHING AN INTERCONNECTED SURFACE WATER WORKING GROUP

This Memorandum of Understanding ("MOU") is entered into this ___day of ____2025 (the "Effective Date"), by and between the UNITED STATES BUREAU OF RECLAMATION ("USBR"), the FRIANT WATER AUTHORITY ("FWA"), SAN JOAQUIN RIVER RESTORATION PROGRAM RESTORATION ADMINISTRATOR ("SJRRP RA"), and the Groundwater Sustainability Agencies of the COUNTY OF MADERA ("MCGSA"), the CITY OF MADERA ("CMGSA"), the MADERA IRRIGATION DISTRICT ("MIDGSA"), the MADERA WATER DISTRICT ("MWDGSA"), the GRAVELLY FORD WATER DISTRICT ("GFWDGSA"), the ROOT CREEK WATER DISTRICT ("RCWDGSA"), the NEW STONE WATER DISTRICT ("NSWDGSA"), the MCMULLIN AREA ("MAGSA"), and the NORTH KINGS ("NKGSA"), collectively hereinafter referred to as the "Parties," and excluding USBR, FWA, and the SJRRP RA as the "GSA Parties" or singularly herein referred to as a "Party."

RECITALS

- A. WHEREAS, groundwater and surface water resources within the Madera and Kings Subbasins of the San Joaquin Valley Groundwater Basin (DWR Bulletin 118 No. 5-22.06 and 5-22.08 respectively) ("Subbasins") are vitally important resources, in that they provide the foundation to maintain and fulfill current and future environmental, agricultural, domestic, municipal, and industrial needs, and to maintain the economic viability, prosperity, and sustainable management of the Subbasins; and
- B. **WHEREAS**, agricultural production in Madera and Fresno Counties supports one of the world's foremost agricultural areas and plays a major role in the economy of Madera and Fresno Counties; and
- C. WHEREAS, in 2014 the California Legislature passed a statewide framework for sustainable groundwater management, known as the Sustainable Groundwater Management Act, California Water Code § 10720-10737.8 ("SGMA"), pursuant to Senate Bill 1168, Senate Bill 1319, and Assembly Bill 1739, which was approved by the Governor on September 16, 2014, and went into effect on January 1, 2015; and
- D. **WHEREAS**, the Subbasins have been designated by the California Department of Water Resources ("DWR") as high-priority subbasins in a condition of critical groundwater overdraft and subject to the requirements of SGMA; and
- E. WHEREAS, SGMA requires that all medium and high priority groundwater basins in California be managed by a Groundwater Sustainability Agency ("GSA"), or multiple GSAs, and that such management be implemented pursuant to an approved Groundwater Sustainability Plan ("GSP"), or multiple GSPs; and

- F. WHEREAS, the nine GSAs that are party to this MOU are as set-forth above and depicted in Exhibit A; and
- G. WHEREAS, GSPs for the Subbasins have been approved by DWR; and
- H. WHEREAS, the Subbasins are currently working on their first statutorily required Plan Amendments and/or Periodic Evaluations that are due to DWR in January 2025; and
- I. **WHEREAS**, the Parties have been meeting in good faith to discuss interconnected surface water-groundwater ("ISW") since late 2023; and
- J. WHEREAS, USBR, FWA, and the SJRRP RA have interest in groundwater sustainability in the Kings Subbasin and Madera Subbasin as memorialized in comment letters uploaded to the SGMA portal dated May 14, 2020, December 16, 2020, September 30, 2022, and June 2, 2023; and
- K. WHEREAS, the Parties recognize that ISW and any resulting losses/gains in stream flow are impacted by numerous variables, many outside the control of the GSAs that are parties to this MOU; and
- WHEREAS, FWA is a public agency formed by its members to, among other things, preserve and protect the rights and benefits of its members in the Central Valley Project; and
- M. WHEREAS, both USBR and FWA member agencies are signatories to the Stipulation of Settlement dated September 13, 2006 with the plaintiff's coalition led by Natural Resources Defense Council (collectively referred to as the "Settling Parties"); and
- N. WHEREAS, both USBR and FWA have certain obligations to maintain and protect flows in the San Joaquin River under the Stipulation of Settlement dated September 13, 2006; those flows are protected pursuant to California Water Code § 1707, and
- O. **WHEREAS**, the SJRRP RA is jointly selected by the Natural Resources Defense Council and FWA and provides recommendations to the Secretary of Interior and the Governor of California regarding specific elements of the Stipulation of Settlement dated September 13, 2006 related to the San Joaquin River Restoration Program's Restoration Goal, and
- P. **WHEREAS**, Madera Irrigation District is a signatory to the Stipulation of Settlement dated September 13, 2006; and

- Q. **WHEREAS**, the GSAs set-forth herein are not signatories to the Stipulation of Settlement dated September 13, 2006; and
- R. **WHEREAS**, nothing in this MOU changes, supersedes, or otherwise alters USBR and FWA obligations under the Stipulation of Settlement dated September 13, 2006; and
- S. **WHEREAS**, the Parties agree that nothing in this MOU changes, supersedes, or otherwise alters any existing agreements and/or rights held by the GSAs, their underlying landowners, FWA, and/or USBR; and
- T. WHEREAS, SGMA identifies undesirable results as the effects caused by groundwater conditions occurring throughout a subbasin related to six sustainability indicators, including depletions of interconnected surface watergroundwater that have significant and unreasonable adverse impacts on beneficial uses and users of the surface water; and
- U. WHEREAS, DWR has released three papers on ISW and depletions of ISW aimed at providing GSAs and the California water resources community with informational resources to help identify, understand, and communicate the nature, occurrence, and estimation of depletions of ISW; and
- V. **WHEREAS**, SGMA requires GSAs to develop and implement GSPs to avoid undesirable results and mitigate overdraft within 20 years; and
- W. **WHEREAS**, the GSA Parties acknowledge that they cannot control groundwater conditions not caused by groundwater management activities outside of the geographical boundaries for the GSAs set-forth herein; and
- X. WHEREAS, the Parties, individually, have undertaken efforts to analyze ISW along the San Joaquin River from Millerton to the Mendota Pool as depicted in Exhibit B; and
- Y. WHEREAS, subject to the conditions below, the Parties desire to collaboratively study, review, and analyze ISW and any associated impacts (including during the implementation period of the GSPs) in a cooperative and coordinated manner.
- Z. **NOW, THEREFORE**, in consideration of the mutual promises, covenants and conditions contained herein and these Recitals, which are hereby incorporated herein by this reference, the Parties agree to collectively analyze ISW along the San Joaquin River reaches depicted in Exhibit B for depletions of ISW as follows:

AGREEMENT

- WORK PLAN IMPLEMENTATION AND COLLABORATION. The Parties agree to work collaboratively on potential refinement and subsequent implementation of separate but coordinated ISW Work Plans for the Subbasins.
- 2. DATA SHARING. The Parties agree that individual work products have been prepared and/or will be prepared as it relates to ISW along the San Joaquin River reaches depicted in Exhibit B. Such information may include, but is not limited to, groundwater levels, flow measurements, river channel bottom elevations, San Joaquin River stage data, estimate of river losses, analysis of existing Holding Contracts, and analysis of riparian diversions. To the extent provided by law and regulations and subject to any privileges directing non-release, the Parties agree to share such information as has been or will be prepared with each other.
- **3. TECHNICAL COMMITTEE**. The Parties shall establish a Technical Committee ("Committee") that will assume various coordination and management responsibilities, potentially including, but not limited to:
 - a. Potential refinements to the ISW Work Plans (described in Section 1)
 - b. Facilitating data sharing and collaboration among the Parties
 - c. Coordinating implementation of the Work Plans among the Parties (described in Section 1).

The Committee shall include at least one technical staff representative from each of the Parties and shall meet no less than quarterly.

- **4. TERM**. The Parties agree that the term of this MOU shall continue for the duration of the GSP implementation period until groundwater sustainability is achieved in the Subbasins by or before 2040 and/or until otherwise directed by the Parties. Any Party may withdraw from this MOU by providing written notice to the other Parties.
- **5. RECOGNITION OF INTENT**. The Parties agree that execution of this MOU signals the mutual intent of the Partes to collaboratively work together and that such mutual intent shall be conveyed to DWR and/or the State Water Resources Control Board (SWRCB) as may be required.
- **6. IN-KIND SERVICES**. Unless otherwise agreed to by the Committee and solely with respect to the GSA Parties, the Parties agree that time and resources associated with activities performed under this MOU shall be done so through in-kind services.

- **7. ENVIRONMENTAL REVIEW**. The GSA Parties agree to cooperatively complete any environmental review as may be determined necessary for activities contemplated and/or planned under this MOU.
- 8. NOTICES. All notices required or permitted by the MOU shall be made in writing, and may be delivered in person (by hand or by courier) or may be sent by regular, certified, or registered mail or U.S. Postal Service Express Mail, with postage prepaid, or by facsimile transmission, or by electronic transmission (email) and shall be deemed sufficiently given if served in a manner specified in this Section 8. If sent by regular mail, the notice shall be deemed given 48 hours after it is addressed as required in this section and mailed with postage prepaid. Notices delivered by United States Express Mail or overnight courier that guarantee next day delivery shall be deemed given 24 hours after delivery to the Postal Service or overnight courier. Notices transmitted by facsimile transmission or similar means (including email) shall be deemed delivered upon telephone or similar confirmation of delivery (confirmation report from fax machine is sufficient), provided a copy is also delivered via personal delivery or mail. If notice is received after 4:00 p.m. or on a Saturday, Sunday or legal holiday, it shall be deemed received on the next business day.

- 9. NO EFFECT ON RIGHTS. Nothing in this MOU may be construed as affecting the rights of the Parties to comment on or challenge as to legal compliance under SGMA or other applicable law any provision of a GSP or management action that a GSA Party may subsequently adopt, including with respect to matters pertaining to ISW.
- 10. REPRESENTATION OF SIGNATORY AUTHORITY. All Parties to this MOU warrant and represent that they have the power and authority to enter into this MOU and the names, titles, and capacities herein stated on behalf of any entities, persons, states, or firms represented or purported to be represented by such entities, persons, states or firms and that all former requirements necessary or required by the state or federal law in order to enter into the MOU have been fully complied with. This MOU may be signed in counterparts, electronic or digital or otherwise, each of which will constitute an original. This MOU may only be amended or modified by a written instrument executed by all of the Parties.
- **11. ADDITION OF PARTIES**. Additional parties may be added to the MOU at any time through unanimous consent of the Parties. Such consent shall not be unreasonably withheld.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the Parties have caused this MOU to be executed and agree to be bound by the terms herein, as of the Effective Date listed above.




They have hired facilitator Dave Ceppos to assist with both. There have been initial meetings with Dave Ceppos. The Joint GSP Amendment is out for public review and a public workshop will be held on December 5, 2024 via Zoom.

3. GENERAL MANAGER'S REPORT

- 3a. Update of Activities
 - Madera-Chowchilla Water & Power Authority
 - Mid-Pacific Water Users Conference, January 29-31, 2025

GM Greci reported the ACWA Fall Conference is being held this week with Directors Janzen and Davis attending. GM Greci stated the Mid-Pacific Water Users Conference will be held January 29-31, 2025 in Reno.

GM Greci reported on the Madera-Chowchilla Water & Power Authority. The Power Plant 980 drop shoot was repaired by MID staff. It was a high priority project that had to be completed before the contractor began repairs on the plant. GM Greci reported the 980 Power Plant was taken apart by the contractor for repair and found 9 of the 12 bolts that hold the hub snapped off. The contractor will make repairs at their shop and then put the plant back together.

4. <u>NEW BUSINESS</u>

4a. Discussion / possible action on execution of Consulting Services Agreement for external independent auditing services, Resolution No. 2024-21

MOTION: Director Loquaci / Director DaSilva to approve the execution of Consulting Services Agreement with Hudson Henderson, Resolution No. 2024-21.

DISCUSSION: Controller Furstenburg stated a Request for Proposals was released on October 7, 2024 with responses due by November 6, 2024. The District received 2 proposals, and both were rejected. The District has previously worked with Hudson & Company. After rejecting both proposals, the District requested a proposal from Hudson & Company. Controller Furstenburg stated one proposal was rejected because it had an error in the cost proposal and the other proposal was rejected because it was double the price. The Hudson & Company proposal meets the needs of the District and is the most fiscally responsible proposal.

PUBLIC COMMENT: President Erickson opened public comment and closed public comment due to no comments from the public in attendance.

NOES: ABSTAIN: ABSENT: 4b. Discussion / possible action on adopting the 2025 Budget, Resolution No. 2024-22

MOTION: Director Loquaci / Director DaSilva to adopt the 2025 Budget as presented, Resolution No. 2024-22.

DISCUSSION: Controller Furstenburg stated the 2025 proposed budget totals approximately \$27,686,000 and includes \$10,000,000 in water costs. The operating budget, excluding water costs, totals approximately \$17,686,000. Salaries and benefits comprise 26% or \$7,129,000 of the proposed 2025 budget. The following assumptions were used to budget salaries and benefits for 2025: cost of living based on the Consumer Price Index for Urban Wage Earners and Clerical Workers of 3%, overtime of \$50,000 and merit increases of \$180,000.

Controller Furstenburg noted capital expenditures and capital improvement projects of \$1,628,000 or 6% of budgeted expenditures are included in the District's proposed budget. Of this total, \$1,128,000 is included for capital expenditures and \$500,000 for capital improvement projects.

The following are the assumptions used to budget water costs 100% Class 1 water supply or 85,000 acre-feet and no Class 2 water supply, 24,000 acre-feet for Hidden Dam, the District projects 40,000 acre-feet will be available for delivery, 7,400 acre-feet of Pre-1914 water from Soquel, and 3,943 acre-feet of 2024 Class 1 water rescheduled to 2025. The District budget includes \$1,000,000 for an additional Operations and Maintenance charge from the United States Bureau of Reclamation (USBR).

Controller Furstenburg stated the proposed budget includes \$2,560,000 (9% of budgeted expenditures) for annual debt service for the 2015 Bond. Also, included in the proposed budget is \$1,679,000 (6% of budgeted expenditures) for the annual debt service for the 2016 Bond. AGM Nolan noted there will be a prepayment made for the bonds this year that will be paid from the reserve funds. Director Davis questioned when the bonds will be paid. AGM Nolan replied in 2026 and there are callable bonds in the next 1 ½ years that will be paid from the reserves. The bonds will be paid 14 years early and will cut MID growers' taxes.

Director Loquaci stated instead of spending District money on attorneys, the District is investing in infrastructure and putting in basins to improve the groundwater situation. AGM Nolan noted when the District was spending millions on attorneys' fees the total budget was about \$10 million.

Director Erickson stated the District is spending \$1 million a year to fix infrastructure that should have been done years ago. The District also saves money by having District staff complete the projects. GM Greci stated the District is making its way through the projects in the Capital Improvement Plan, but projects come up as things break.

Controller Furstenburg reviewed the 2025 proposed budget with budget codes. The gates budget was increased by \$20,000 and safety – equipment, apparel, training, testing, and shoes increased by \$10,000 for confined space training and fall protection training. The propane budget was increased by \$8,000 and herbicides and rodenticides budget was decreased by \$100,000. Director Davis questioned why the propane budget has increased so much since 2023 when it was \$1,021. OMM Contreras stated increased costs and the need to burn more.

The building – maintenance, grounds, pest control, landfill, and janitorial budget was increased by \$95,000 for electrical and building upgrades to the Old Engineering building for a warehouse for the storekeeper. The budget for diesel was increased by \$50,000 due to increased work at the basins. The membership fees, licenses, and dues budget code was increased by \$85,000 due to the Friant Water Authority additional costs. The groundwater management budget from 2024 will be carried over and an additional \$50,000 will be included. AGM Nolan stated the funds are being carried over because the Board already approved the amount for the GSP updates and the process is ongoing. The phone, radio, internet, and alarm budget code was decreased by \$30,000. The legal fees budget code was decreased by \$168,000. The consulting expenses budget was increased by \$69,000.

The board meeting and election expenses budget will be rolled over if the invoice is not received in December. At this time, it is not known how much the invoice will be. Controller Furstenburg stated \$500,000 for MCWPA – power plant cost will be budgeted for 2025 with the end of year 2024 remainder being carried over.

OMM Contreras reviewed the requested Capital Expenditures from the O&M department. The following requests were made tractor and mower with attachments, two regular cab trucks for Canal Operators, ag tractor, drag scraper, and heavy duty offset wheel disc. Also, including the Capital Expenditure requests include SCADA software replacements, equipment and vehicle diagnostic service kit. The budget includes \$200,000 for a recharge project. All capital expenditures from 2024 not paid for yet will be rolled over. The 2025 budget includes \$500,000 for pipeline replacements and \$200,000 in carryover; however, NRCS will reimburse a portion of the projects.

Director Janzen stated it would be beneficial to include a breakdown of the \$10 million in water costs. AGM Nolan stated the \$10 million in water cost is a placeholder until the District has an idea of the water year.

The proposed organizational chart was reviewed. The proposed authorized positions are 66 with 7 positions vacant, and 7 positions not funded for 2025. The following positions will be listed as vacant in 2025 and filled Equipment Operator, Mechanic I, 2-Maintenance Worker I, Maintenance Worker II, Canal Operator II, and Canal Operator I.



Bonita Water District Municipal Service Review

Dear Mr. Braun:

I am writing on behalf of Madera Irrigation District ("MID" or the "District") to provide its comments on the Bonita Water District ("BWD") Municipal Service Review ("MSR"). MID appreciates the opportunity to provide comments on the MSR to the Madera County Local Agency Formation Commission ("Madera County LAFCo"), and requests that the Madera County LAFCo consider and incorporate these comments before finalizing the MSR and/or considering the petition for form BWD.

MID's mission is to obtain and manage affordable surface water and groundwater supplies in a manner that will ensure the long-term viability of irrigated agriculture in the District. As a result, MID generally supports the efforts of landowners outside the District to more

efficiently manage and use their surface water and groundwater supplies, or bring more surface water into the County of Madera.

A. MID's Position on Area to Be Annexed

MID understands that some of the properties BWD seeks to include in its service area are within MID's sphere of influence. MID also understands that Madera County LAFCo is seeking MID's position on whether it intends to annex any of those areas. As a result, I am writing to confirm that MID does not have an intent, nor a desire, to annex any of the lands within the proposed boundaries of the BWD into the district.

B. MID's Comments on the MSR

In light of MID's Mission, it is important that the MSR accurately describes existing conditions and does not overstate the potential water supplies available to it. As a result, MID offers the following comments on the MSR:

Reliance on MID Water Supplies. In many instances, the MSR suggests that BWD will seek to largely rely upon MID's water supplies to serve its lands. For example, Table 3-4 of the MSR summarizes MID's water rights, Section 3.3.2 describes BWD's use of a diversion point on the Colony Extension Canal to purchase operational management water from MID, and various sections of the MSR (including Section 3.3.3.6) discuss an 18-inch pipeline to connect MID's existing facilities to a diversion point on the Fresno River near Road 16. While BWD's proximity to the District has in the past created opportunities for some landowners in BWD to receive certain water supplies from MID, such as operational management water, the continued availability of such water is (i) uncertain, (ii) often restricted based on the type of water available to MID, and (iii) ultimately at the full discretion of MID.

As a result, the MSR should be modified to clarify that MID is under no obligation to convey, transfer, or deliver water to BWD, and that any decision to do so is at the ultimate discretion of MID.

Fresno River Water Rights. The MSR also includes discussion regarding Fresno River riparian rights enjoyed by some of the parcels within the proposed BWD. As a condition of its State Water Resources Control Board (the "SWRCB") License No. 13836, MID is obligated to make releases from Hidden Dam to satisfy downstream rights to the waters of the Fresno River, pursuant to the Fresno River Operations Protocols (the "FROP") and the Fresno River Allocation Model (the "FRAM").

On October 18, 2018, MID filed a Petition for Adjudication of the Fresno River (the "Petition") with the SWRCB. The Petition was granted at the SWRCB's October 20, 2020, meeting (the "Effective Date"). Because of MID's reasonable expectation that it would take several years for the issues in the Petition to be fully and finally resolved, MID adopted further

protocols to manage releases pursuant to the FROP and the FRAM while the Petition is pending: the Pre-Adjudication Plan of Administration ("PAPA").

The MSR includes several statements that need to be modified. Specifically, the MSR asserts that the existing water infrastructure within BWD includes three existing water diversions points from the Fresno River, and two from Berenda Creek, both in Section 2.3 and in Section 3.3.2. First, there are only two water diversions from the Fresno River; the other is from MID's Canal 24.2-17.0. In addition, only one of the two water diversions off the Fresno River is recognized as being eligible for riparian water supplies under the PAPA. In addition, there is only one water diversion from Berenda Creek, which only received operational management water from MID.

The MSR also notes BWD's desire to improve existing diversions on the Fresno River and Berenda Creek. We understand the California Department of Fish & Wildlife ("CDFW") has typically required landowners to go through the streambed alteration process to make such improvements. (See Fish & Wildlife Code, § 1602.) Permits/approvals from other agencies may also be required. Further, only one of the diversions on the Fresno River is recognized under the PAPA; to the extent BWD's landowners contend any other point of diversion may receive water from the Fresno River, those landowners will need to address those contentions to the SWRCB through the proceedings on the Petition.

Further, a riparian water supply can only be used on the property that enjoys that riparian supply. (*Rancho Santa Margarita v. Vail* (1938) 11 Cal.2d 501, 528; Water Code, §§ 101, 102.) Moreover, a landowner's right to riparian water is correlative. Because the Fresno River is fully allocated, the amount of water a landowner may receive from its recognized point of diversion is governed by the FROP, the FRAM, and the PAPA.

As a result of the foregoing, the MSR should be modified to clarify:

- MID manages riparian water supplies from the Fresno River pursuant to the FROP, the FRAM, and the PAPA.
- Riparian water received from the Fresno River by any land within BWD may only be used on that land with riparian rights.
- The points of diversion on both the Fresno River and Berenda Creek. Noting that riparian water supplies from the Fresno River are available at only one of the points of diversion under the PAPA.
- Recognition of the possible need for additional permitting in the event BWD or its landowners seek to install or improve existing diversions on the Fresno River and Berenda Creek.

Adequacy of Groundwater Supplies & SGMA Compliance. The MSR asserts "groundwater supplies within the BWD are adequate . . . " This is inaccurate. The BWD properties are within a high priority subbasin under the Sustainable Groundwater Management Act ("SGMA"), with water levels continuing to decline. More urgently, the BWD properties are within the jurisdiction of the Madera County Groundwater Sustainability Agency ("Madera County GSA"), which has yet to successfully implement any of the measures articulated in its Groundwater Sustainability Plan ("GSP") or been able to effectuate a funding source for any such measures. Instead of generally asserting groundwater supplies are adequate, the MSR should accurately describe the challenges regarding groundwater within BWD. Madera County LAFCo should also consider the relationship between BWD and the Madera County GSA, since BWD's service area lies within the Madera County GSA's boundaries. For example, the formation of BWD may result in a need to modify the boundaries of the Madera County GSA. In addition, both the Madera County LAFCo and the applicants should consider the various items necessary for GSA coordination, including participation in the Groundwater Sustainability Plan Updates, coordination agreements with other GSAs located in Madera County, domestic well agreements. and other obligations.

Dear Mr. Braun and Mr. Trebor,

I'm writing this letter on behalf of the Bonita Water District (BWD) proponents, the lest and Diepersloot families (Landowners). We've recently received written feedback and have had meetings with several local water agencies, including Madera Irrigation District (MID) and Chowchilla Water District (CWD), regarding the previously submitted Municipal Service Review (MSR) and the January 28, 2025 Water District Formation Hearing before the Madera County Board of Supervisors. We appreciate the thoughtful review and valuable feedback.

We agree with many of the points that have been raised and will incorporate the necessary revisions to the MSR to ensure that it accurately reflects the conditions and legal framework surrounding BWD's water supplies and its relationship with MID and others. Specifically, we will address the following key issues:

- Reliance on MID Water Supplies: We recognize that the MSR has stated that BWD receives surface water from MID and the availability of such water is uncertain, restricted, and entirely at MID's discretion. We agree that the MSR should make it clear that MID is under no obligation to convey, transfer, or deliver water to BWD. We will revise the MSR to emphasize that any such decisions will be subject to MID's discretion and that future surface water supply from MID to BWD cannot be guaranteed.
- 2. **Fresno River Water Rights**: We acknowledge there is only one diversion point from the Fresno River eligible for riparian water under the Pre-Adjudication Plan of Administration (PAPA). We





will revise the MSR to clarify this and ensure that it accurately reflects the need for any additional permitting should BWD or its landowners seek to modify or improve existing diversion points on the Fresno River or Berenda Creek. Further, both lest and Diepersloot families are active participants in the State Water Resources Control Board's (SWRCB) statutory adjudication of the Fresno River.

3. Adequacy of Groundwater Supplies & SGMA Compliance: We acknowledge concerns regarding the adequacy of groundwater supplies within BWD. The MSR correctly asserts that groundwater supplies are "adequate" for the Landowners because of their ability to purchase surface water, divert a significant quantity of flood flows for groundwater recharge, and the ability to fallow and/or single crop (as opposed to double crop) during years of drought. We will provide historical records which demonstrate our ability to purchase and/or divert surface water and accomplish significant groundwater recharge.

We understand that the term adequate wasn't explained thoroughly and, as has been pointed out by others, that BWD's service area lies within two high-priority subbasins—the Madera and Chowchilla Subbasins, where water levels are continuing to decline, and subsidence is prevalent. We will revise the MSR to provide a more accurate assessment of the challenges regarding groundwater supplies in the Madera and Chowchilla Subbasins and our ability and willingness to be a proactive partner. One of the goals of forming BWD is to provide solutions to more sustainably manage groundwater within BWD.

4. **Coordination with Madera County GSA**: We understand that BWD's formation may necessitate coordination with the Madera County GSAs and could have implications for the existing boundaries of the GSAs. We will ensure the MSR addresses the need for BWD to work with the Madera County GSAs, especially the Madera County GSA which is currently the GSA for the unmanaged "white areas" and to consider the necessary coordination agreements, including potential modification of the GSA boundaries, participation in GSP updates, domestic well agreements, and other obligations. We agree that these matters are important for LAFCo's review and will make the appropriate revisions to reflect these concerns.



We value the opportunity to collaborate with all stakeholders to ensure that the MSR accurately represents the current state of water resources in the region. Once we have incorporated the necessary revisions, we will provide you with a revised draft for your review and further comments.
